FEATURE STORY:

New CME Identifier Released: CME-711

CME-711, a Trojan Downloader that is spread as an attachment to emails with news headlines as the subject lines which downloads additional security threats, was assigned on January 20, 2007.

Aliases for this threat include Aladdin: Win32.Small.dam; Authentium: W32/Downloader.AYDY; AVIRA: TR/Dldr.Small.DBX; CA: Win32/Tibs!generic; ClamAV: Trojan.Downloader-647; ESET: Win32/Fuclip.A; Fortinet: W32/Small.DAM!tr; F-Secure: Small.DAM; Grisoft: Downloader.Tibs; Kaspersky: Trojan-Downloader.Win32.Small.dam; McAfee: Downloader-BAI; Microsoft: W32/Vxidl.gen!B; Norman: W32/Tibs.gen12; Panda: Trj/Alanchum.NX; Sophos: Mal/EncPk-B; Symantec: Trojan.Peacomm; and Trend Micro: TROJ\_SMALL.EDW.
